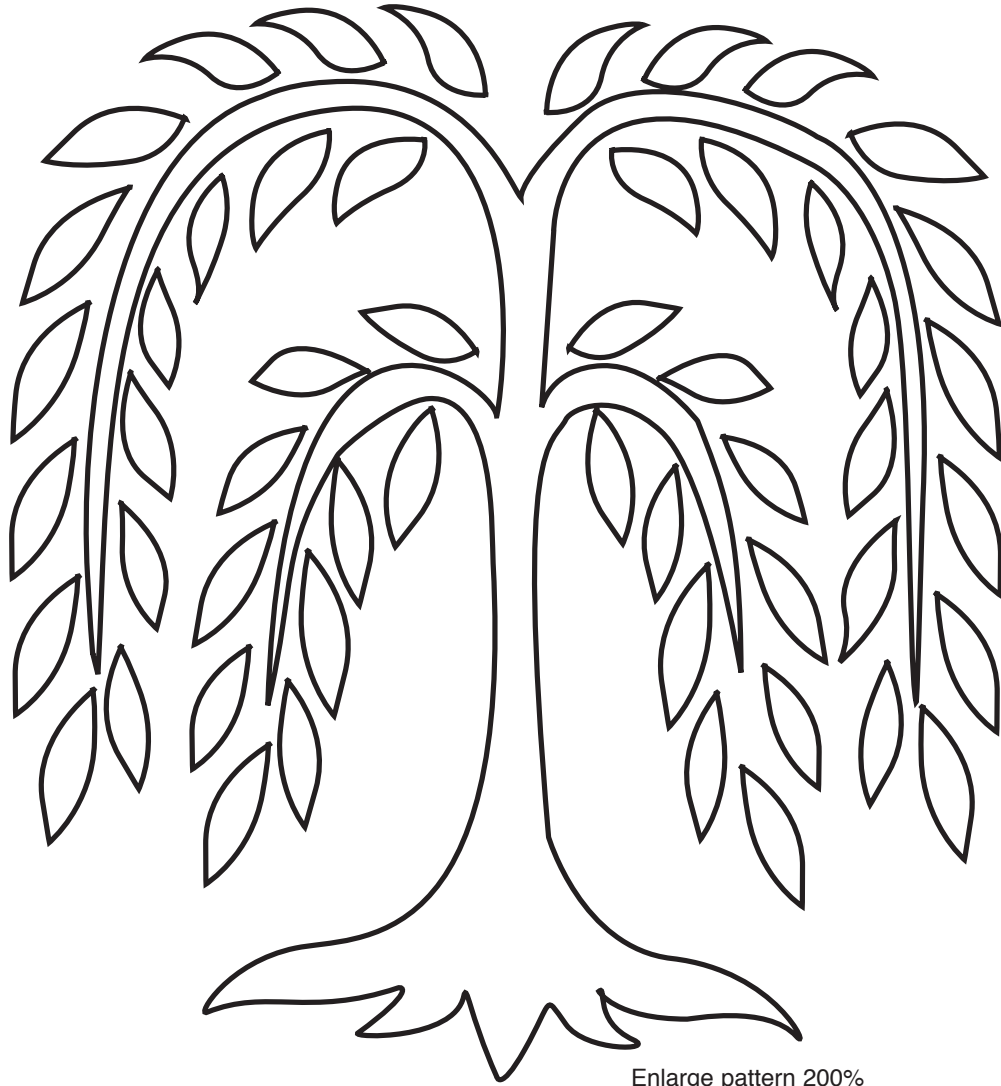

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# Crows in the Corner

QUILT SIZE: 67" x 67"

## Fabric Requirements:

From the Colonies™ Archives collection by Windham Fabrics, you will need the following:

2-1/2 yds. #26671 (tan) – center block & borders

3 yds. of assorted 1/4 yds., half dark and half light fabrics – pieced blocks

4 yds. – backing fabric

1/2 yd. – binding fabric

## Cutting & Assembly:

Center Block – cut one 18-1/2" square of #26671 (tan).

**\*HELPFUL HINT:** Overcut the center square, appliqué the tree and crows and THEN cut down the square to an exact 18-1/2".

Pieced Blocks – make 32 pieced blocks, 9" finished.

For EACH block, cut:

(3) 3-1/2" squares

(3) 4-1/2" squares – light fabric

(3) 4-1/2" squares – dark or medium fabric



Make six half-square triangle units by drawing a diagonal line on the back of the light 4-1/2" squares. Place a light and a dark 4-1/2" square, right sides together, and stitch 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and press open. Trim these units to an exact 3-1/2".

Make 16 predominantly dark blocks and 16 predominately light blocks and alternate their placement when sewing them into rows, according to the quilt photo.

Borders – from tan fabric #26671, cut (2) 6-1/2" x 54-1/2" & (2) 6-1/2" x 67". Add two borders to opposite sides of the quilt. Add the two remaining borders. Fuse appliques on two of the corner borders (see quilt photo).



Appliqués – trace patterns for tree, branches and crows onto a lightweight, sewable fusible web. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for application. **\*HELPFUL HINT:** After fusing the appliques to the quilt top, secure by stitching around them with invisible thread, using a very narrow zig zag stitch.

Layer, quilt and bind your finished project!
